Pediatric Consultation Report

Reason for consultation

Nancy was referred following her 6-month well-baby assessment because her parent had noticed intermittent inward turning of the left eye. The deviation had been present for approximately one month and was not associated with redness, discharge, trauma, or developmental regression.

Assessment

Nancy was alert, interactive, and developmentally appropriate during the visit. She fixed and followed with both eyes. An intermittent left esotropia was observed, more noticeable when focusing at near. Extraocular movements were full. Red reflexes were symmetric. No ptosis, nystagmus, or focal neurological findings were identified.

Impression

Intermittent left esotropia with a risk of amblyopia if the deviation becomes persistent. The examination did not identify an urgent neurological concern today.

Recommendations

1. Arrange a formal pediatric ophthalmology assessment, including cycloplegic refraction, within 4 to 6 weeks
2. Ask the family to monitor how often the eye turns inward and whether the deviation becomes constant
3. Seek urgent assessment if Nancy develops constant eye deviation, abnormal eye movements, vomiting, lethargy, or developmental regression
4. Nancy appeared mildly pale and her parent reported a recent decrease in appetite; please order a CBC and ferritin to assess for iron deficiency
5. Book a primary-care follow-up after the laboratory results are available and continue routine well-baby care
